Indeed, the Bible has a few instances where the idea of the least common denominator raises its head in questions like "what must I do to inherit eternal life" or "who is my neighbor." While there is more than meets the eye in questions like these, surely one of the implications is: what is it that I absolutely must do so my salvation is not in peril.

It is always refreshing when one meets people who are not interested in getting away with being Christians in name only. People who do not want to cover their lives merely with a thin veneer of an religious aura but who want to be 'All In' and who do not shy away from acknowledging that it is pretty hard work to walk the walk of faith.

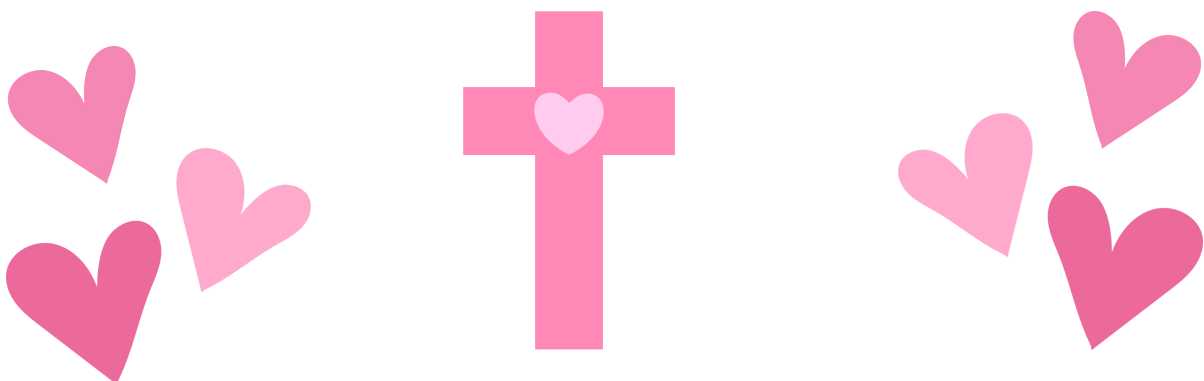
There is no doubt: living a life that is aligned with Jesus is a very, very difficult task. More often than not when we think 'I've got that', we find out that we just fooled ourselves. Yep, loving enemies, being generous, and forgiving without counting can become a drag. Living even a barely "Christian-Enough-Life" is not particularly glamorous by definition. When will we ever appropriately appreciate the undeserved grace and mercy God shows us? Will we ever truly master the Good-Samaritan lifestyle that looks out for the neighbor first before we take care of our own real or perceived needs?

We often hear people say that they 'practice their faith'. Well, we are practicing for sure and we are practicing without any guarantee that we will come to a point when and where we can say: well, the goal has been achieved. Rather, at least for me, it is always frustrating to realize that our best attempts are subject to failure. It does not help that Scripture reminds us in different passages that even our best efforts and greatest works are "like filthy rags." Martin Luther certainly was very right when he taught us that we are simultaneously 100% saint and sinner!!!

I recently came across a quote by Dr. Luther: "This life therefore is not righteousness, but growth in righteousness, not health, but healing, not being but becoming, not rest but exercise. We are not yet what we shall be, but we are growing toward it, the process is not yet finished, but it is going on, this is not the end, but it is the road. All does not yet gleam in glory, but all is being purified."

We are an unfinished work. We indeed will continue to be purified. And while today we might only be "Christian enough", tomorrow God may lead us onto a path that is ever more faithful and glorious, honoring and praising God's holy name, following His precepts ever more diligently. For it is true and sure: God continues to love us sinners, bestows the righteousness of Christ upon us, and with open arms receives us as we beg His forgiveness.

- New Sign - They are finishing up making the framework.
- Programmable Thermostats – The council approved getting them ordered and installed.

Todd will be talking with a couple families on possible donations to cover all the updates. (Current sound board is 30 years old and parts are not available if it breaks down.)

**The first week of Lent** we hear the call of Christ, telling us to be salt and light in this world of sin. We who have tasted and seen his great love for us on the cross can spend our Lent savoring his salvation and shining with his glory and grace in the places where he has put us.

**The second week** of the season brings us the discipline of prayer and fasting. We grow in our relationship with Christ by communicating with him, and we learn more about him and ourselves by giving up those things that can distract us from our connection to him.

Join us again for the **third week of Lent**. In this service we recognize that so much of our lives, even in Lent, is spent worrying about what might happen or what has happened. Christ teaches us to stop being anxious, but simply to trust that he knows what is best and will take care of us to the very end.

**Week four of Lent** leads us to recognize that we live in a very judgmental world, so Jesus' advice not to judge sounds radical to our modern ears. When we leave all judgment up to God, we free ourselves to look at one another through fresh and forgiving eyes.

**The last week of Lent** we want to be reminded that we build our lives on very shaky foundations, and then we are surprised when things start collapsing. Jesus teaches us that the only solid foundation is he himself, the Rock of our salvation. On him alone we build.

## Hometown Cookin' Favorites

This time of the year when we have cold windy days, soups are very welcoming. Soups are quick to make and can be very nutritious. Soup can be changed to add whatever you want with various seasonings and other ingredients that you may have in your pantry.

### Taco Soup

Ingredients:

- 2 pounds ground chuck
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 2 packages mild taco seasoning
- 1 package dry ranch dressing
- 3 cans diced tomatoes
- 1 can Rotel
- 1/2 cup sliced black olives
- 1 can kidney beans
- 1 can pinto beans
- 1 can whole kernel corn
- Water, for desired thickness

Instructions: Brown ground chuck and onion; drain. Mix with other ingredients and bring to a boil. Turn down heat. Simmer for 1 hour, or use a large crock pot and cook for 4 to 5 hours on low. Serve with tortilla chips and garnish with finely shredded Cheddar or Monterey Jack cheese.
